Conclusive Evidence

The excerpt facts and research used in this report were taken from <http://unexplained-mysteries.com>, <http://crimelibrary.com>, and <http://carpenoctem.tv/killers/zodiac.html>.

The author of this report moved to Napa, California, around 1989. She is readily familiar with the area. Her concept of the valley was shrouded in a cloud of deep darkness that she could not pin point. It seemed to be there day in and day out. Kini went to college and attempted to live as a straight American. She was sick and tired of being discriminated against and believed that if she appeared to be married and have children, her sexuality could go undetected. This would not be so.

Zodiac followed a few vague patterns. He had always attacked after sundown on weekends, always attacked young couples in or near their cars, and always attacked in remote suburban areas near water. He went to great lengths to immobilize his victims which would make this author believe that he has somehow obstructed access to the courts to force her to be "a slave in Paradise" and by placing her at risk for human trafficking. A learned, pragmatic behavior, can be improved upon with experience, as shown by the foresight evinced by the killer when he foiled a potential callback from the Napa police switchboard by leaving the phone off the hook. The Zodiac was bold with his encounters with the police and throughout the research Kini found that he would go within a few blocks of the police departments to use phone booths seeking credit for murders. Although investigators seem to portray a given Zodiac pattern, the author of this report does not see any reason why he could not change his modus operandi at

any given time especially a self-proclaimed “clever” individual.

While trying to unravel a missing \$100k trust fund, Kini stumbled upon a postcard with a 1909 historical photo of the Napa County Courthouse. It was about five years ago that she was listening to a documentary by Scotland Yard about Jack the Ripper and his Masonic relationships. This triggered research that ultimately led to Zodiac research. Upon the review of the employment and academic record of Napa Superior Court Judge Ronald T.L. Young, Kini began to see parallels.

For instance, though a town mentioned by the killer is generally given as Deer Lodge, Montana, a reliable source reports that the state was not Montana but Colorado. (Fern Lock?) His interviewer suggests “Lodge,” and victim agrees. “Deer Lodge” was then suggested as a northwest city with a federal penitentiary, ...Subsequent inquiries to the northwestern authorities revealed that there had been no such jailbreak or murder.

Finally, the Zodiac had never taken credit for this attack in a letter as he had for the Vallejo and San Francisco attacks. That makes this author believe that he like the Napa County area and may have had plans to homestead.

The letters he sent to various media’s were usually riddled with misspellings and bad grammar, the killer was initially believed to be a discretionary illiterate, with little education beyond popular films and novels, but some believe that his prolific writings reveal a working knowledge of chemistry, geometry, and literature that points toward higher education.

The time of day, the lingering, the weapon, and the absence of a follow-up letter offering proof of the author’s culpability--are to most investigators outweighed by the circumstantial evidence of similar handwriting, weight, and general description, not to mention the phone call after the incident. Behaviorally, the variations in MO and signature can be ascribed to the growing boldness, calculation, and self-gratification of a developed serial killer.

Meanwhile, the true Zodiac would have had to suppress his most identifiable character trait. While intriguing, this hypothesis requires a suspension of disbelief that is simply too great for most investigators.

The killer was meticulous in his efforts to deprive the police of any physical evidence which may today appear as why Napa County Superior Court Judge **Ronald T.L. Young** has not been on the bench for the last two years. Perhaps to wipe away his fingerprints. It would only make sense that the reason the Zodiac Killer was never discovered is because he must have had a prestige job. And, as far as this author believes, being a paralegal, no finger prints are required for any of the listed employment positions or academic colleges. Below are this author's conclusive theories.

Could this come from a country life living in Iowa? (Farm chemicals?)

The **death machine** is all ready made. I would have sent you pictures but you would be nasty enough to trace them back to developer + then to me, so I shall describe my masterpiece to you.

...[I]t wont do to re roat + reschedule the busses because the bomb can be adapted to new conditions.

[Here the Zodiac's crossed-circle has been modified with five Xs drawn along the symbol's left side]

...[T]o prove that I am the Zodiac, Ask the Vallejo cop about my electric gun sight which I used to start my collecting of slaves.

No explanation was given for the marks along the Zodiac symbol's perimeter, but it was assumed that each one represented a murdered victim. At this time, the Bates murder had not yet been linked to the Zodiac, and this has been seen as a suggestion that the Bay Area killer was not responsible for the murder in Riverside. This drawing remained unpublished until 1996, when posted on web.

Penultimate Kill

Very close to where she was murdered police found mystifying graffito, "The Juwes are the men That Will not be blamed for nothing."

9/27/69 Lake Berryessa attack. Only time he used knife. Had a conversation with victims. Suspect wore a somewhat elaborate costume with characteristic crosshairs on a circle symbol sewn into the front of his cloak, which was otherwise a squared-off hood with eyeholes, masked by clip-on sunglasses.

10/14/69. San Francisco Chronicle received a letter from Zodiac (12th) "souvenir"-a bloody swatch from Paul Stine's shirt.

Driver's side door of vehicle, wrote:

According to Unexplained Mysteries, There was always an element of the prankster in Zodiac.(Amusing himself). But in letters he quoted from Gilbert & Sullivan's The Mikado, premiered in London. (1885)

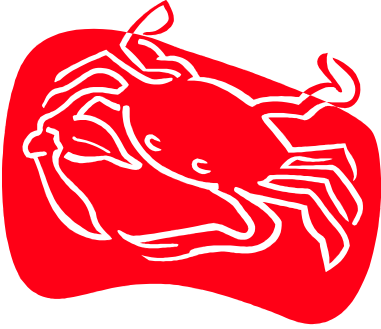
Zodiac's favorite character was The Lord High Executioner, and in one letter, Zodiac even quoted, apparently from memory, from that character's most famous aria, wherein the Executioner sings of a "little list" of people he has in mind to do away with, **should the opportunity ever present itself.**

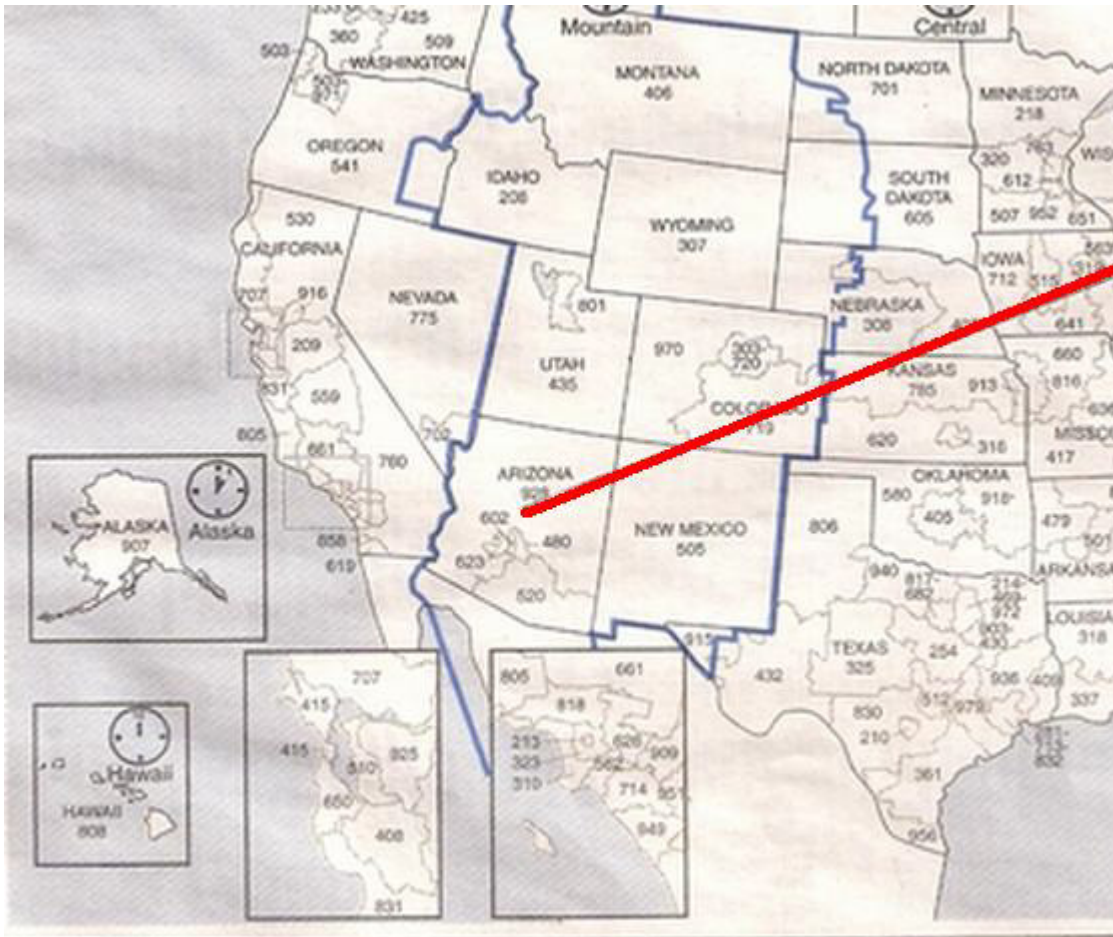

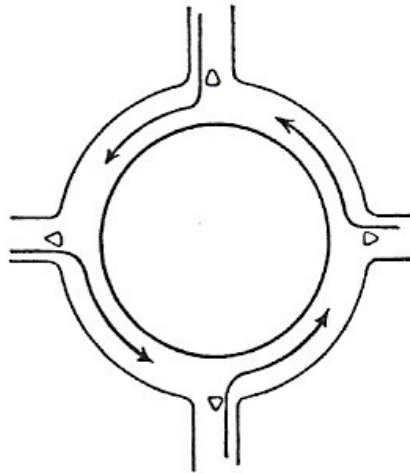
Possible Known Travels of Ronald T.L. Young Before 1973
